Sept. 4 - *The Way Way Back* (2013) 103 min. Steve Carrell, Toni Collette—Shy 14-year-old Duncan goes on summer vacation with his mother, her overbearing boyfriend, and her boyfriend's daughter. Having a rough time fitting in, Duncan finds an unexpected friend in Owen, manager of the Water Wizz water park.

Sept. 18 - *A Most Wanted Man* (2014) 122 min. Philip Seymour Hoffman, Rachel McAdams— A Chechen Muslim illegally immigrates to Hamburg, where he gets caught in the international war on terror.

Oct. 2 - *Safety Not Guaranteed* (2012) 86 min. Aubrey Plaza, Mark Duplass—Three magazine employees head out on an assignment to interview a guy who placed a classified ad seeking a companion for time travel.

Nov. 6 - *Foxcatcher* (2015) 134 min. Steve Carrell, Channing Tatum—The greatest Olympic Wrestling Champion brother team joins Team Foxcatcher led by multimillionaire sponsor John E. du Pont as they train for the 1988 games in Seoul - a union that leads to unlikely circumstances.

Nov. 20 - *Enough Said* (2013) 93 min. Julia Louis-Dreyfuss, James Gandolfini—A divorced woman who decides to pursue the man she's interested in learns he's her new friend's ex-husband.

Dec. 4 - *Tim's Vermeer* (2013) 80 min. Tim Jenison, Penn Jillette—Inventor Tim Jenison seeks to understand the painting techniques used by Dutch Master Johannes Vermeer.

Dec. 18 - *Auntie Mame* (1958) 143 min. Rosalind Russell, Forrest Tucker—An orphan goes to live with his free-spirited aunt. Conflict ensues when the executor of his father's estate objects to the aunt's lifestyle.

Feb. 5 - ***Lincoln*** (2012) 149 min. Daniel Day-Lewis, Sally Fields—As the Civil War continues to rage, America's president struggles with continuing carnage on the battlefield as he fights with many inside his own cabinet on the decision to emancipate the slaves.

Feb. 19 - ***Selma*** (2014) 128 min. David Oyelowo, Carmen Ejogo—A chronicle of Martin Luther King's campaign to secure equal voting rights via an epic march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama in 1965.

Mar. 4 - ***Stagecoach*** (1939) 96 min. John Wayne, Claire Trevor—A group of people traveling on a stagecoach find their journey complicated by the threat of Geronimo and learn something about each other in the process.

Mar. 18 - ***Philomena*** (2013) 98 min. Judi Dench, Steve Coogan—A world-weary political journalist picks up the story of a woman's search for her son, who was taken away from her decades ago after she became pregnant and was forced to live in a convent.

Apr. 1 - ***Whiplash*** (2014) 107 min. Miles Teller, J.K. Simmons—A promising young drummer enrolls at a cut-throat music conservatory where his dreams of greatness are mentored by an instructor who will stop at nothing to realize a student's potential.

Apr. 15 - ***Birdman*** (2014) 119 min. Michael Keaton—Illustrated upon the progress of his latest Broadway play, a former popular actor's struggle to cope with his current life as a wasted actor is shown.

May 6 - ***Mr. Turner*** (2014) 144 min. Timothy Spall, Paul Jesson—An exploration of the last quarter century of the great, if eccentric, British painter J.M.W. Turner's life.

May 20 - ***Age of Adaline*** (2015) 109 min. Blake Lively, Michiel Huisman—A young woman, born at the turn of the 20th century, is rendered ageless after an accident. After many solitary years, she meets a man who complicates the eternal life she has settled into.

Jun. 3 - ***Interstellar*** (2014) 169 min. Matthew McConaughey, Anne Hathaway—A team of explorers travel through a wormhole in space in an attempt to ensure humanity's survival.

Jun. 17 - ***McFarland USA*** (2015) 128 min. Kevin Costner, Maria Bello—Jim White moves his family after losing his last job as a football coach. He sees that some of the students are worth starting a cross country team and turns 7 students with no hope into one of the best cross country teams.
